Agenda Item 6b. Review Subordination Water Management Strategy

In July 2018, a preliminary summary of the draft water supplies from the *Subordination* of *Downstream Water Rights* was presented to the RWPG. *Subordination of Downstream Water Rights* is a major water management strategy for surface water users in the 2021 Plan. Under regional planning rules and guidelines, existing surface water supplies must be evaluated using WAM Run 3 (strict priority order). In Region F, under WAM Run 3, most surface water supplies have no availability because the inflows must be passed to senior downstream water right holders. This strategy evaluates yields of Region F Colorado Basin supplies when the lower basin senior water rights are subordinated to the upper basin (Region F) rights.

This agenda item will present the final results for the subordination analysis for all major reservoirs in Region F and the City of Junction's run-of-river water rights. The supplies from this strategy will be used to reassess water needs for recipients of the subordinated water, which is discussed in Agenda Item 6c.
